

MINUTES of a meeting of LLANIDLOES WITHOUT COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The Minutes of the last meeting, having been circulated, were approved by Councillors and were signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING

Conditions of roads in area - No work had been done to any of the roads.

Water Gauge, Llanidloes - Nothing further to report

Bridge below Clywedog Dam - Clr. G.M. Jones reported that a new bridge would be in place by May 2026.

Viewing point overlooking Clywedog Dam - The clerk was asked to report this to Severn Trent.

Bridge between Tynwtra and Tanhinon - The clerk read out a letter received from Mrs Edwards, 4 Tanhinon regarding use of the bridge and asking that it remain. The clerk was asked to write to Rights of Way Department putting the Council's views forward.

State of streets in Llanidloes - The town clerk has passed our concerns onto Powys County Council.

Road past Caencoed, Glan-y-Nant - This road is in a poor state of repair and in some places dangerous. Clr. G.M. Jones travelled this road 18 months ago with County Clr. Glyn Preston and no improvements have been done. The clerk to raise this matter again.

Road by Clywedog Caravan Park - This has been reported.

Burnside, Glan-y-Nant, Llanidloes - Clr G.M. Jones met with the Officer on site and he stated that the side of the road is not registered with Powys County Council and it is not their responsibility to cut the tree back. He will try and find out who owns it, and the resident would prune the tree back himself.

Provision of Salt - Councillors asked when would Powys put salt out on the side of the roads for the winter. The clerk to write to Powys County Council.
