

Minutes of a meeting of LLANIDLOES WITHOUT COMMUNITY COUNCIL

The Minutes of the last meeting, having been circulated, were approved by Councillors and were signed by the Chairman.

MATTERS ARISING

Conditions of Roads in Area Nothing has been done to improve the condition of roads in the area. Gutters and drains are full up and have not been cleaned and the roads are deteriorating.

Road from Llanidloes to Hafren Forest Clr. F. Franz-Morgan has travelled this road and seen the problems created by the increased traffic accessing Hafren Forest. The verges are a big problem and need to be stoned, more pull ins are needed and NRW need to take some responsibility for the condition of this road. Better signage would help to alleviate this problem with traffic being directed up past the Clywedog Dam not the single file road up through Old Hall. Some signage has been provided but there is none on the Newtown side of Llanidloes. Clr. G.M. Jones asked are the roads being inspected on a regular basis which would highlight many problems.

Viewing point overlooking Clywedog Dam This work is in hand and Rangers have been asked to cut back foliage and trees in this area.

Road by Caencoed, Glanynant No change the culvert is still blocked.

Road by Clywedog Caravan Park Nothing to report

Code of Conduct Training The Code of Conduct training recording is available to Councillors. The file is view-only and cannot be downloaded. The clerk has requested an invoice and these will be issued in due course for payment to be made. Cheques will be an accepted for of payment.

Marie Curie Daffodil Appeal 2026 Councillors agreed to support the Marie Curie's Great Daffodil Appeal in 2026 and a donation of £200 was agreed. The Clerk was instructed to pay.

Flooding of 36 Victoria Avenue A response received from Powys County Council states that there is nothing wrong with the drains and the owner should put a step in place to the front

door. Clr. Jones reported that debris on the kerbs will cause further problems. Clr Frantz-Morgan reported that the drains have been cleaned and a clean up of the streets will be done in March, but cars parked on the sides could cause problems. Houses in this area have had problems previously with cellars being flooded and the drains have no outlets. The River Severn is higher now due to increase in gravel levels. The roadside trees are also not being cut back.

Road from Coed-y-Bontyn to Crowlwm Leaves have covered this road making it a terrible mess.
